#### What men need to know

Our research (2022) found that only 54% of men know that prostate cancer is the most common cancer for men and that 4 out of 5 men didn't know that ethnicity was a risk factor. The below are further examples of what men think. We'd recommend proactive conversations with men, to empower and educate.

## Three things to let men know

Proactive conversations addressing the below will support men in making informed decisions about their prostate health.

#### What men think

- I'll be invited for a test right?
- It's a finger up the bum isn't it?
- I'm not feeling poorly so I don't need to worry....

## What men should be told

- Educate men about
- Risk factors
  Prostate-specifications
- Prostate-specific antigen (PSA) blood test pros and cons
- It's a PSA BLOOD test
- They can refuse digital rectal exam (DRE)

Earlier stages of prostate cancer for many men has no symptoms
